

The Passenger Control in charge will ensure an accurate count of the number of

The In Charge will report when all liferafts are deployed for that station. As the evacuation stations are closed, crew are to move to the nearest active evacuation.

Identify themselves to the passengers in your survival craft as crew and take charge.
Open up the survival craft emergency pack – consult instructions as required. Dispense seasick pill as soon as possible.
 Check surrounding area for possible passengers in the water, safely maneuver to them and bring onboard.
 Dispense thermal protective aids as required. Check amongst the passengers for injuries. Administer first-aid as required.
Dry liferaft floor, if applicable.
Close canopy openings to retain warmth and keep from shipping water. Try to busy the passengers with various tasks to keep their mind occupied. Maintain a look out.
Prepare for rescue.
