#### Stage 2 - Mustering Passengers

#### A - Passenger Control Party Initial Response all crew members assigned Passenger Control duties receive instructions on mustering the passengers and the nature of the emergency. The In Charge gain passengers attention and give specific passenger control instructions. All crew will identify themselves as crew and take charge of the passengers in their area of responsibility. Crew will use the standard passenger control techniques as listed on the Passenger Control checklist Crew will ask for any special needs or person requiring assistance to identify themselves. Arrangements will be made to assist those persons Crew will report to the In Charge on the areas they have sweep and checked for passengers. In Charge will report the status of the areas swept (cleared) of passengers to Await further instruction from B - Passenger Control Party Response Guidelines When the Passenger Control Crew will commence the following without further instruction until directed otherwise. If not already completed, Passenger Control Crew to Passenger Control Crew throughout the vessel will provide directions in a clear and concise manner Instructions will be given that the muster is purely a precautionary move. The Passenger Control In Charge will gain the attention of passengers providing reassurance this is only a precautionary action. will be assigned additional passenger control duties. Crew will ask for any special needs or person requiring assistance to identify themselves. When all the passengers are mustered the crew shall obtain an accurate count of the passengers at the station. This count will be relayed to

Activities at the Stations during Abandan Ship
Activities at the Stations during Abandon Ship All activities at the embarkation decks will be supervised by the following:
Refer to MES training manuals for the specific tasks.
The In Charge at each station will keep an accurate count of the number of passengers evacuated at their station. Passenger counts will be given to pverseeing the evacuation. The tallies will in turn be relayed
The In Charge will report when all Liferafts are deployed for that station.
Final Determination of Passengers Evacuated The In Charge at each station will communicate the final tally This information will be checked against the vessel passenger count and become part of the emergency log.
Passengers who may be taken elseware for medical reasons must also be tracked.  Assistance from local authorities, RCMP may be required.
Crew Assignments to Lifesaving Appliances
Final Duties –

- Ensure the last position broadcast for external rescue notification.
- Ensure a final sweep of the vessel completed and all passengers and crew are accounted for.

- Records for the number of passengers evacuated from each station, confirming tally sheets are taken.
- Log books and other pertinent documents collected.

Leaves vessel by best means available.

Stage 5 – Post Abandon Ship

On entering the survival craft the crew members shall:							
establish contact							
Identify themselves to the passengers in your survival craft as crew and take charge.							
<ul> <li>Open up the survival craft emergency pack – consult instructions as required.</li> </ul>							
<ul> <li>Dispense seasick pill as soon as possible.</li> </ul>							
<ul> <li>Check surrounding area for possible passengers in the water, safely maneuver to them and bring onboard.</li> </ul>							
Dispense thermal protective aids as required.							
Check amongst the passengers for injuries. Administer first-aid as required.							
Dry liferaft floor, if applicable.

<ul> <li>Try to busy the passengers with various tasks to keep their mind occupied.</li> </ul>							
Maintain a look out.							
Prepare for rescue.
